

Free The Girls!

In 2013 The Heart of Longmont became a drop -off location for donations of new or gently used bras to be given to Free The Girls and assist in helping survivors of human trafficking! Second-hand clothing is a profitable market in many countries around the world and bras are usually sought after items. Some of the girls in the Free The Girls program are making 3-5x the minimum wage in their community by selling bras!

Our local UMW coordinates the efforts of folding, packaging, and distributing the bras on an ongoing basis. Our 2013 Spring Sling Bra Drive brought in nearly 1,500 bras and over \$600 was raised for Free The Girls. **Bra-vo, church**, thank you for your continuing support!

Fast forward to 2017, and we have either shipped or delivered 6,000 bras to the Free The Girls warehouses! Free The Girls (www.freethegirls.org) is an international non-profit organization devoted to coming alongside sex trafficking survivors with a path to true freedom. It's a journey from horrific trauma to reintegrating into the life they were meant to live within their family and community. Their goal for true freedom is measured by economic freedom, restored health, social well-being, education, and opportunity for a different, hopeful future.

ALL THIS FROM A BRA!!! (and a used bra, at that!)

Here we are in 2019 and Free The Girls provides services in Mozambique, Uganda, El Salvador, and will soon be assisting survivors in Costa Rica. In 2013, our collection of 1,500 bras helped provide 30,000 bras to eager survivors in Mozambique. The end of 2018 Free The Girls reached the 1 Millionth bra collected milestone!

National Freedom Day is being celebrated by Free The Girls on March 14^{th} – and, as a Drop-Off location, we are invited to share our story and help increase the awareness of our mission to help as well as share the stories of the women and families we have helped.

- Zip lockbags GallonFreezer








- Dark flannel cotton fabric no animals, bugs, or eyes

Bishop Karen Oliveto's Book is Available!



The library has recently acquired Bishop Karen P. Oliveto's book, "Our Strangely Warmed Hearts: Coming Out Into God's Call." To quote the cover notes, "In the United Methodist Church and other Christian denominations, it is difficult or impossible for lesbian, gay, transgender, and bisexual clergy or laity to become visible, outward channels for God's saving grace. Karen Oliveto traces the church's history with this struggle with homosexuality. . . ." "The book also includes first-person narratives from LGBTQ persons faithfully serving in a denomination that denies their calls—

and in some cases—their presence."

Given that a special session of the United Methodist General Conference will be held in St. Louis in February 2019 to examine and possibly revise every paragraph of The Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality, we have placed a copy of Bishop Oliveto's book on the library table in the gallery, along



with several other books written by and/or about some in the LGBTQ community, so that we can become acquainted with some of those for whom this Commission will attempt to speak.



Movie Recommendation: Green Book



Since February is Black History Month, and Keith Watson noted that in our mission moment on Sunday February 9, I believe it would be good to add that the movie "Green Book", which has been playing in theaters lately, is a good lesson in Black History, and the challenges and progress historically endured during and since the 1950s and 1960s.

Its ultimate lesson, without spoiling the plot, is that we won't and don't fully respect

someone (who is different in any way: racially, or sexual identity, or even just ethnically) until we can develop a full and deep relationship with them, and that any and many of our simplifying assumptions can be and often are hurtful and damaging to that relationship. Lastly, it also shows the ultimate courage which is required to commit to such a relationship, as well as the some of the benefits that result from that relationship.

It is based on a true story, which adds value and veracity to it. But I can honestly say, in the end, I had a notably heightened awareness of both my past errors and future opportunities. Thus I was quite glad I had seen the movie. I think you will be too!




Save the date! - Build Day April 6
